

Enguerrand of Camprond, Lord of the Manoirs of Le Lorey and Camprond took part in the 1st Crusade with Robert Shorthose, Duke of Normandy and son of William the Conqueror. Later in the 16th Century, the Luzerne family succeeded the Camprond family and in the 17th Century Le Lorey and Camprond became two distinct Fiefdoms.Le Lorey remained in the ownership of the La Luzerne family















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
